- Revise K-12 PE, VPA, and World Language curriculum resulting in written and followed/useful documents (to Board Spring 25)
- Begin reviewing and revising K-8 ELA curriculum and resources, resulting in high quality resources and written and followed/useful documents (to Board 2025)
- Revise and transform Grades 9 -10 ELA, Science, and Social Studies curriculum to include engaging, place/community-based learning that also gives students voice and responsibility for driving their learning (to Board 2025)
- With the Cultural Consciousness and Competency Subcommittee, develop rubrics to review our curriculum, lessons, and resources for cultural inclusiveness, representation, and accuracy. (Pilot 12/23 and 5/24)
- With the Wabanaki Studies Workgroup, continue to expand, implement, and evaluate Wabanaki Studies throughout the district
- Support work to challenge and stretch all students, including publishing accelerated learner pathways and options on our website (5/24)


Making our programing for accelerated learners clearer and more transparent
